About myself:

A probinsyano like President Rody, I was born and raised at Cabcaben, a barrio of Mariveles, in the province of Bataan. I received my elementary education at Cabcaben Elementary School, graduating at the top of my class. Seeing my potential, my parents sent me to Far Eastern University- Boy's High School in Manila. I took Pre-law at Colegio de San Juan de Letran and got my Law degree from The University of the East. In 1976, I passed the Bar Examination on the first try.

About work:

After becoming a professional lawyer, my first job was at Ford's Philippine Stamping Plant at the Bataan Export Processing Zone (BEPZ) in Mariveles as the in-house Counsel and Labor Relations Officer and later promoted as the Industrial Relations Manager. After the People Power Revolution, I was appointed Vice-mayor of my hometown in Mariveles, Bataan. Subsequently, I was elected as a member of the Provincial Legislative Board of Bataan. Finishing my term limit as a Provincial Board Member, I was appointed PEZA Administrator of the Bataan Economic Zone. During my watch as administrator, my first focal point was to stop the perennial labor strikes which crippled the Economic Zone. Holding dialogues with various labor unions, I challenged them to stop the work stoppage and in return I will help them improve employee welfare and benefits. Under my term, with the help of the Bureau of Customs, foreign investments improved because we put a stop to smuggling in the economic zone. From the Bataan Economic Zone, the PEZA Director General requested me to manage the Baguio Economic Zone. After putting the PEZA-Baguio in order, I was told to go to Mactan Economic Zone in Cebu. However, the Governor of Bataan asked me to go back home and be the Provincial Administrator until the end of his term.

Why I want to work with President Rody?

During our college days, President Rody and I were dorm mates at the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) of Manila together with BIR commissioner Billy Dulay, Labor Secretary Bebot Bello, and DFA Secretary Jun Yasay. At the YMCA, we shared a close camaraderie, a strong bond among the dorm mates. We saw and talked to each other every day. We were just young men, waiting for our allowances from our parents in the provinces. What we will be in the future is of no moment among us. As President Rody aptly said in our last reunion, "if you finished your schooling and become a professional while living at the YMCA, you are a different breed of man."

My vast experience and extensive knowledge of the intricacies of PEZA will contribute to the success of President Rody's noble aspiration to create more jobs for our countrymen by promoting our country as a premiere investment hub. That is the reason why I requested to President Rody to be appointed as the Director General of the Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA) when the YMCA dorm mates were called to Davao City last June 28, 2016.
